It is these events that remind everyone of the importance of the partnership between the school and the parent community.



Our teachers were impressed by our creativity, we thought of some very funny imaginative worlds! In history we learned about how different lives for children could be during the Victorian era. We learned all about chimney sweeps, using our knowledge to create an advert calling for workers. Although we made these adverts we discussed and agree that working conditions for children were not ok and agree with the laws that banned children working as chimney sweeps in the future. In maths we returned to money, learning about adding money, giving change and creating amounts of money out of coins and bills. Money can be challenging, but we rose to the occasion! In science we learned about absorbency and tested how absorbent different materials are. We have really enjoyed how hands on this term of science has been! Finally in DT we finished off our crown pillows! We are so proud of our sewing skills, who knew sewing could be so hard! Our pillows are wonderfully decorated and fit for a King or Queen! We cannot believe the term is almost over!







Year 3 has thoroughly enjoyed working on Edward Tulane this week. We have been on many adventures, and it has been a roller coaster of emotions. This week we focussed on Hobo songs! It was so much fun as we sand to the class our ballads. We then discussed different sections of the story and feelings that Edward is being exposed to. In maths we are working on Geometry, Perimeter and Area of shapes. Lucky we know our timetables! This week our science projects have been on display, and it has been absolutely amazing what we have created and made at home. The judges have had a tough week. Teachers also learnt so many new facts and about and loved talking to each and everyone to understand how they created and came up with such fabulous ideas! Well done Year 3.





We had a great time celebrating Science Week in year 4. We were invited to Maida Vale school to attend a science show that taught us about energy stores. We learnt about the different types of energy and loved taking part in experiments.

We also created science projects which we presented to our parents and peers during the science fayre. We had a great time completing them and finding out about how the world is connected.

In English, we started learning about fractured fairy tales and about perspectives in stories. This is great as we are also reading the book Wonder which teaches us about how a change in narrator can change a story.





This week in geography, year 5 have been learning about the uses of the River Thames. Did you know that from the 1600s – 1800s the River Thames was used to host Frost Fairs when the river was frozen during the winter months. Splitting into groups, the children were asked to research the other uses of the Thames, ones used today including: farming, domestic use, leisure, habitats and transportation.









In English, the children have been analysing poetry. They have focused on spotting rhyming patterns in various poems, incluiding ones from hundreds of years ago. Comparing the poems was a helpful lesson for the children as they began to think about elements they would like to incorporate into their own rhyming poems.

In maths, the children have been learning all about rotation and order of rotational symmetry. We looked at regular shapes and also more unusual shapes and patterns, including fidget spinners!

They also worked hard completing their spring math assessment. Well done, year 5!


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Friends of Chepstow
