
Message from Mrs Barr

We would like to start by saying a huge congratulations to a selection of the year 5 and 6 girls who went to Bisham Abbey over the weekend for a netball tournament. The girls played 9 netball matches across the two days, consumed more snacks that we thought possible and sung their hearts out to High School Musical at movie night. There were some incredibly tough teams at the tournament, but the Chepstow Girls kept a smile on their faces and were as polite and happy as ever which was noted by one of the external umpires who worked with them on both days.

This week in Athletics the children have been working on hurdling races in preparation for sports day. We have been working in small groups as relay races to complete an obstacle of hurdles. We have discussed health and safety aspects of the equipment as well as the quickest way to get over the hurdle.

In tennis this week the children have been working on paired floor tennis, starting in a star position, and swinging low to high to return the ball across the floor back to their partner. The KS2 children have been working on returning the ball over the net and maintaining a rally. The Year 5 and Year 6 children have also been enjoying playing short matches on a small court for points. What an amazing week we have had in year 1. The children have dived into their literacy in learning the story of Handa's Surprise and come up with some amazing actions! In Maths the children have further embedded their knowledge of addition, using many classroom resources, such as 100 squares and number lines.

This week has been extra special with our trip to Kensington Palace. We got to look around the palace and learn about the toys Queen Victoria enjoyed playing with, when she was our age! We looked at the similarities and differences and compared them to the toys we play with at home and school.









Another week has flown by and we can not believe it, but it has been a week full of learning and excitement! In literacy we started our author study on Roald Dahl, using our researching skills to create a fact file of important information about Roald Dahl and his life. We have learned so much about him, ask us a fun fact, we would love to share! In maths we focused on number, looking at estimation, rounding, writing numbers and much more! We put our green thumbs to use in science after learning about hydroponics and the bean life cycle. We learned all about why hydroponics may be helpful living in a city, and even started our own mini runner bean farm in our classrooms! We cannot wait to see how our plants grow as they move through the bean life cycle. We expanded our knowledge of Mexico and its geography, drawing on our previous knowledge of atlases, human and physical features.



Well done Year 3 on your sports this week! The sports team really put you to the test!. We are loving the sportsmanship and camaraderie. This week we continue to always work hard and to enjoy ourselves. In maths we have been working on addition and all the different ways of adding. We have worked on our inference skills and investigated newspaper headlines. Learning the 5 w's has helped us to condense important facts and get the news out as effectively and efficiently as possible. Our history topic continues to explore amazing explorers like Neil Armstrong and we are going to be looking into female explorers next week. Can you think of any? Lastly geography always takes us to the other side of the world as we learn to use our map skills and explore the location of mountains and learn their names.







